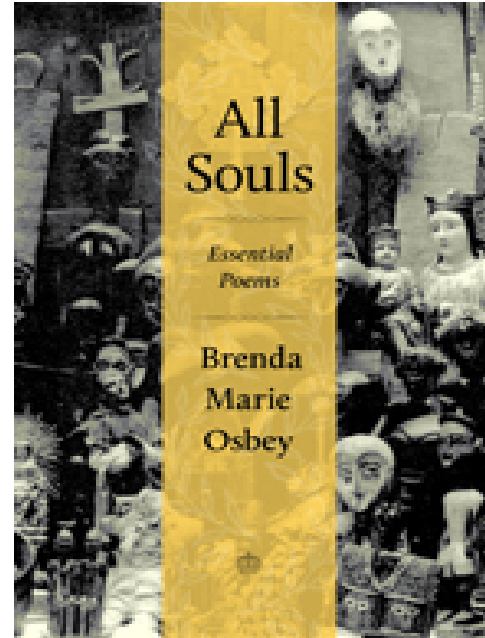
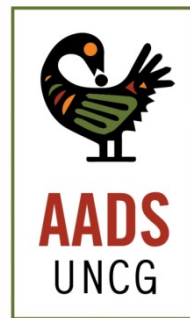


The African American and African Diaspora Studies Program at
